'2 Johns' Virtual Parent Workshop



I hope that many of you were able to join the 2 John's e-safety session on Monday evening. It really brought home to me the potential perils of children being unsupervised online and how easily they can be influenced negatively, even by the most innocent-seeming you tube video!

The advice was very clear that as parents we should teach our children how to be safe online in a stepped and considered way, in much the same way that we dangle their toes into water when they are toddlers as the first step towards teaching them to swim. We need to teach our children to play safely online, gradually increasing the boundaries when we know they will be safe. We need to create a parent / child relationship where children know that they can talk to you if they see anything online that frightens or worries them - without fear that you will just take their device off them. If they think that is the case, they won't talk to you for fear of losing their online life.

Please:

- Play games like Roblox and Minecraft alongside and with your child, so you can see how they are interacting in the game.
- Watch You Tube with your child, so you can see the You Tubers that they
 enjoy and ensure that the content is suitable
- Ensure that location services are switched off on your devices, so that your family address cannot be found
- Tik Tok is not recommended at all for this age group, but if you do decide
 to allow your child to have an account please create a parent account
 and then add the child account to your parent account so that you can
 carefully monitor the content.

It was shocking to hear how many of our children in the Infants have up to 200 'friends' on Roblox - that makes them extremely vulnerable to predatory adults.
